Matthew 5:1-10

There is a progression in the beatitudes that mirrors the progression we experience as we grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior. This progression is actually a building upon each of the prior beatitudes. The meekness we gained in the last lesson will help us to be merciful. And that is what we will be discussing in this lesson.

Matthew 5:7

Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.

The first four beatitudes addressed the attitude of those in the Kingdom of God. This fifth beatitude speaks of action.

Mercy - Eleos - "kindness," "beneficence,"

Merciful – Eleemon - Compassionate

Mercy is "the moral quality of feeling compassion and especially of showing kindness toward someone in need."
